PARISH NEWS

Social Services News Our Parish Social Ser-vices Committee is involved in several aspects of parish life. During this Lenten season, the Committee is planning a number of outreach programs for the poor and needy in cooperation with local charities. Two of these initiatives are described below and how parishioners may participate.

40 Cans for Lent The Social Services Committee and Ewing Knights of Columbus invite everyone to participate in this program throughout the Lenten season. Instead of giving up something for Lent, consider giving out something. The idea is to donate one canned food item for each day of Lent, or 40 cans. As Jesus fasted for 40 days and nights, we will be collecting and delivering canned goods to our local charities to help with the nutritional needs of poor families in the Trenton area.

Please leave your donated cans of fruit, soup, or vegetables in the designated area in our Church Hall, which we will deliver each week to Mount Carmel Guild and Catholic Charities. You don't have to wait until the end of Lent to bring your donation to the church. You may donate as often as you'd like; one-can-per-day, once a week, or whenever you visit the Church.

<u>Frozen Food Donations</u> We would like to thank all parishioners who donate frozen food items for our local charities, especially those who share their food by using our food trays. Food trays and instructions are available in all Church vestibules.

Please note however, it is very important that <u>all</u> donated food be labeled so the charities know what food they are distributing. Most of our donations are labeled, but each week there are a few unmarked items reported by our delivery volunteers. So please do your part, by making sure to list the contents on all food containers you leave in our freezer so that your food, caring, and effort can best be put-to-work.

Also, if your food tray does not properly snap closed when filled, the food will fall out during handling. If necessary, please secure the tray using a rubber band to insure the tray will stay closed and the food will not fall out.

And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes bream white as light.

When God told Abraham to leave home, God was asking a lot of him. The world was not a global village then. Travel wasn't easy; there were no planes, taxis or hotels. Furthermore, leaving home was a decisive break with all the good of home, because going back for a visit was difficult or just out of the question entirely. So leaving home then was a loss that we can't imagine well anymore in our era of video calls and texting.

Still, when God told Abraham to leave, Abraham went. Why did he go? Presumably because he wanted what God offered him. If Abraham left, God told him, then Abraham would become a great nation, and all the communities of the earth would find blessing in him. That is a fairly stunning reward. So Abraham, who had a great desire for that reward, obeyed God, left what was familiar and beloved to him, and wandered off as a stranger in a strange land.

Of course, as we now see it, all Jews, Christians and Muslims are the Abrahamic peoples. Many great nations are included among the Abrahamic peoples. All of them know Abraham and think that they find blessing in him. And so God's stunning promise to Abraham has been completely fulfilled.

FROM FR. MIKE

As Bishop O'Connell noted in an e-mail to priests this week, he wishes that people would be as engaged in other aspects of Church practice as they are in getting a dispensation from abstinence from meat on St. Patrick's Day.

If you are part of a group having an event that requires dispensation from abstinence, that authority resides only with the Bishop. As the parish Pastor, I do have the ability to dispense individuals from their Lenten observance; but, that dispensation must be requested and it should not be given in a blanket manner.

The response that I will give to those who request such dispensation echoes that of the Bishop: There are very few days of Penitence that are required during the Church year. For that reason, while I will grant the dispensation for St. Patrick's Day on Friday March 17th to individuals who request it, when it is given I would strongly encourage you to transfer the Lenten observance to another day, preferably the preceding day Thursday, March 16th.
