

#### JANUARY 5TH ~ THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." (Matthew 2: 9b)

I wonder if we would have recognized, or choose to recognize, the Messiah had we lived at the time of Jesus' birth. Certainly, many who were learned in the Hebrew Scriptures and leaders of the Jewish people chose otherwise. For all of their knowledge of the law and the prophets, most failed to recognize the numerous signs that they could virtually recite from memory. Others refused to recognize the signs, as they pointed to their own shortcomings, fears and vulnerabilities. The Messiah was a threat to the established

order; his coming would bring change and upheaval – a radical new way of life to all.

In today's Gospel, Matthew tells us of the Magi's visit at the rising of the star. Signs pointed to Jesus, the newborn king. However, not all greeted their visit with enthusiasm, viewing the reported child as a threat to the status quo and their own individual spheres of influence. Herod was particularly troubled; a venal man, he would do everything to preserve his power, choosing to disregard the signs around him. Yet the Magi, foreigners in a strange land, discerned and chose wisely, offering their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh in homage to the newborn king.

Do we recognize Christ as the ruler of our life? Do we see him in the eyes of our fellow men and women? For that is the call to wisdom. Or do we avert our gaze, ignoring what is plainly before us, to preserve our status quo and individual spheres of influence?

We are called to follow the star each time we celebrate the Eucharist. We choose to accept the risen Christ and do him homage. It is a radical conversion of self, prostrating ourselves before the Precious Body and Blood, offering ourselves in humble service to the Lord. Only in such humility are we truly wise and worthy of eternal salvation.

"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." (Isaiah 60: 1)




