

JUNE 18TH ~ ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



11th Sunday in Ordinary Time Ex: 2-6a; Ps 100:1-3,5; Rom 5:6-11; Mt 9: 36 —10: 8

Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine.

The first reading from Exodus described God's special covenant with the Israelites. He led them out of Egypt to the promised land. Despite many hardships, God continued to guide Moses and the people, comforting them and caring for them as they journeyed in the desert. This unique relationship with the chosen people is echoed in today's Gospel reading. Jesus is seen as the shepherd and master harvester. His compassion for the people of Israel is seen in the naming and commissioning of the apostles to go forth "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Although his redemptive mission was later extended to all nations, the primacy of Israel in this Gospel passage reflects their status as "a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

Christ's salvific mission is like a rose blooming in the desert. At first, when the blossom emerges, it is tightly closed and barely visible; later, as it opens, its full beauty unfolds as it grows ever larger — a thing of exquisite grace for all who have eyes. He is the master gardener, who tends to his people with great care and devotion. Similarly, Jesus is seen as a shepherd, one who leads the sheep so that they might no longer be troubled and abandoned.

Yet, Jesus never intended to bring his mission to completion unaided. In the commissioning of the apostles, he chose those who would go out into the world to spread his message of love and redemption. As he has given them a share in his fellowship freely, his disciples are called to share the gift of discipleship as well.

Jesus' unconditional love is most evident in the Sacred Eucharist, the great gift of His Precious Body and Blood. Through his ongoing sacrifice, he offers the nourishment needed to comfort his people. Let us embrace the great gardener, the master harvester, and the loving shepherd — and continue to go forth as disciples to share his message to all men and women who yearn for peace, joy, and eternal life.



Experience the Eucharistic Miracles Exhibit at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church in the Parish Hall from July 23 to August 6, 2023



This traveling exhibit has been created to assist those who will experience it to affirm belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based upon the website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis to catalogue all of the Eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into seven sections or rooms. In the first six rooms information about the Eucharistic miracle is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place in the historical era.

All of the rooms point to the center of the exhibit. This is to intentionally remind us that historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle that is in front of us – Jesus, present in the Most Holy Eucharist! In the seventh room. A separate a room will be available for the Blessed Sacrament visible in the monstrance and a place has been prepared for you to rest a while in His presence.
