

Reflection

Reading I: Proverbs 9:1-6
Responsorial Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7
Reading II: Ephesians 5:15-20
Gospel: John 6:51-58

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."

(John 6: 54)

The words of Jesus, in the continuation of his *Bread of Life* discourse, are familiar to us in terms of our faith in the Holy Eucharist. Yet, to the people of Jesus' time, even to his followers, the reference to the eating of his flesh and the drinking of his blood was jarring, conjuring images of uncleanliness and savagery. The Hebrew Scriptures contain numerous references to uncleanliness from contact with blood, and the need for ritual purification in order to be made

clean. Even today, we of the faith who have the benefit of two millennia of Eucharistic theology, often struggle intellectually with the idea of the real presence of Jesus in his Precious Body and Blood. Later, John's Gospel tells us that this was a pivotal moment in Jesus' ministry; many of his followers returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him.

In today's reading, the Eucharistic Sacrifice is seen in the light of Jesus' suffering and death on the cross.

". . . and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world"

(John 6: 51b)

With Jesus' willing sacrifice for all people, he redeemed us by his blood, giving us a share in the kingdom of our Heavenly Father. Through the Paschal Mystery, Jesus instituted a New Covenant in his person, and we are called to eternal salvation through him. At each celebration of the Eucharist, we turn to the Lord as the source of life in the flesh and body of his glorified body. Christ is the food that does not perish; he is the food of eternal life in the Spirit. As the Son of Man, sent by the Father, has life because of the Father, so do we, who share in the Eucharist, have life because of him.

As physical beings, we need daily nourishment to sustain our bodies. All of us enjoy the pleasure of a fine meal for both physical sustenance and the sharing of family and community. However, physical nourishment is transitory. It does not endure. We are all mortal; our physical bodies will eventually pass away. In the Gospel however, Jesus is not speaking about physical nourishment. Rather he is referring to spiritual food – the Spirit-filled flesh and blood of his divinity.

In his *Confessions*, Saint Augustine spoke of this food from heaven. As he turned away from the illusive pleasures of the body to the life of the Spirit, he noted the eternal nature of the *Bread of Life*. He described the Lord as "the food of grown men," bread from heaven. Unlike earthly food, which is absorbed in the body, becoming the body, this heavenly food transforms us into creatures of eternity.

Let us pray that, as we share in the Precious Body and Blood, that we come to know our Heavenly Father through Jesus Christ – the one, true *Bread of Life*. Strengthened in Jesus, may we grow in faith, hope and love, and remain as God's adopted sons and daughters in Christ. May we remain always single-minded in his service.

"Grow, and you will feed upon me. You will not change me into yourself, as you change food into your flesh, but you will be changed into me."

(St. Augustine Confessions, Book 7, Chapter 10)




Food Donations ~ Are you able to help?
