SEPTEMBER 8TH ~ THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Reflection

Reading I: Isaiah 35:4-7a Responsorial Psalm: 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 Reading II: James 2:1-5 Gospel: Mark 7:31-37

"Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he promised to those who love him?"

(James 2: 5)

Beginning with last Sunday, and continuing through the end of September, the second reading is taken from the Letter of Saint James. The theme of the readings is that we

are called to live out the faith which we profess. Last week, James set the tone for the upcoming weeks: Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. His letter reveals the concern of the infant church to guide the followers of Christ to a life worthy of God's gift of salvation.

Although some dispute the authorship of the letter, most scholars believe that it was written by James, a relative of Jesus, who was often referred to as the "brother of the Lord." He was the leader of the Jewish Christian community and is mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles as representative of that community in matters pertaining to the Church at large. He died as a martyr for the faith around 62 A.D.

In today's reading, James reminds us that we must not show partiality in our faith. Aware of longembedded class distinctions in Jerusalem, as well as throughout society, James admonished those who elevated those of wealth and stature, while acting condescendingly toward those who were poor, outcast or marginal members of society. He reminded his readers that the poor of this world would be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom. Faith and love were the hallmarks of salvation, not affluence or possessions.

I wonder how often we judge a person not on their inner worth, but on how well they are dressed, how attractive or articulate they are, or how rich and powerful they appear to be? I know that I am as guilty as anyone in forming initial judgments about people. However, the years have (thankfully) taught me that appearances can be deceiving, and that I can be mistaken in my initial judgments. Consequently, I have tried (albeit imperfectly) to look beyond superficialities to cherish the essential humanity of those whom I meet. It is only through the grace of God that we can summon the strength and wisdom to do this.

James reminds us of Jesus' message of the importance of living our faith in our works. Words can be empty and hollow; only when we reorient our lives according to the Gospel do we become true followers of Christ. He is the Lord of all, and all are worthy in his sight. As his disciples, we must aspire to his example.


