#### **REFLECTION** <u>Proverbs 31: 10-13, 19-20, 30-31</u> <u>Psalm 128: 1-5 1 Thessalonians 5: 1-6</u> <u>Matthew 25: 14-30</u>


"Well done my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities." (Matthew 25: 21)

There is an old saying: *If you want* something done, ask a busy person. At first, this may seem illogical. Wouldn't it be more effective to ask the person who is doing nothing? After all, they have a lot of time on their hands. Yet it seems that the old 80/20 rule (80% of the work gets done by 20% of the people) holds true, whether it is in matters of work, family, charitable endeavors, or faith. For those who step up and work for the betterment of others, their company or organization, the reward is often -- more responsibility. Society turns to those who are passionate, enthusiastic and engaged. Those who do more, are asked to do more.

Jesus knew this as he sought disciples who were not only faithful, but committed, devoted, and filled with a zeal for the Gospel message. In the parable of the talents, the master entrusted his possessions to his servants to manage while he was away on a journey. To one he gave five talents (a measure of coinage), to another two talents, and to a third, one talent. When the master returned, he called his servants for an accounting. The first two servants used the talents and their resources productively, essentially doubling the master's investment. Yet the third, fearful and timid, merely returned the one talent, having buried it in the ground out of fear. Pleased with the ingenuity and faithfulness of the first two servants, the master gave them greater responsibilities. The third, he admonished for his laziness and took the talent from him to be given to the ones who showed initiative.

We have all been given "talents" by the master, in the form of our innate gifts, and abilities. Do we nurture these talents, cultivating our abilities so that we may work to further the work of the Lord? Or do we recoil in fear and withdraw from the mission set before us? Christ calls us to be disciples, men and women of faith and commitment who are ready and willing to venture forth into the wider world to further the Gospel message. Are we disciples of passion and engagement? Are we ready to use what we are given so that we might return more to the Lord? That is our challenge, to use what we have and journey forth in enthusiasm and joy in service to the one who sent us.
