NOVEMBER 24TH ~ OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE



"You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth." (Gospel)

Reading I: Daniel 7:13-14 Responsorial Psalm: 93:1, 1-2, 5 Reading II: Revelation 1:5-8 Gospel: John 18:33b-37

This is the last Sunday of the liturgical year – more commonly known as the Feast of Christ the King. The focus of the readings is on the glory of the Son of Man. However, the Gospel reading presents a paradox; Christ, standing in chains – a prisoner – is being questioned by Pilate in a trial that will lead to his crucifixion and death. This is hardly a regal image. Jesus had no army, no hordes of soldiers ready to sacrifice themselves for his victory. Even his closest disciples had deserted him in his darkest hour. And so, Jesus stood alone before the one who would decide whether he would live, or he would die.

Jesus' words revealed one in the world, but not of the world – someone apart from the image of a king. Pilate questioned him, but sought not the truth, but rather the expedient means

to settle the matter as effortlessly as possible. Christ's words to Pilate were met with puzzlement. Here was a king, but he had no stately bearing. He was just a man, a man in chains standing before him awaiting disposition of his fate. Yet, in just a few sentences, Jesus revealed himself and his mission to Pilate: "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice." (John 18: 37) Although not recounted in this reading, Pilate reacted with bewilderment. He could ask only, "What is truth?" Yet, he seemed little interested in discovering the true nature of Christ. Pilate's cowardice and indifference to the truth set in motion the final stages of the road to Calvary.

With knowledge of the Resurrection and the gift of faith, we understand that Christ is not an earthly king. He came not to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom of many. His mission was one of love and sacrifice, of offering himself – his very body and blood – for the redemption of mankind. Yet it is this very thing – perfect selflessness – that demonstrates more clearly Christ as Lord and King. He leads by example; he challenges us as his disciples to do the same. He reveals the light of truth, the light that conquers death and banishes the stain of sin, granting all men and women a share in eternal life.

Next week, we begin the new liturgical year and mark the First Sunday of Advent. As we prepare to enter into the Christological mystery anew, let us proclaim Christ as King, now and forever, and offer ourselves to him as he once offered himself for us. **Deacon Steven Szmutko**

Family Sunday ~ Refreshments will follow the 10:30 Mass in the Parish Hall. Join us for some hot brewed coffee and delicious treats.


