

## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT



# Reflection 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent Bar 5:1-9; Ps 126:1-6; Phil 1:4-6,8-11; Lk 3:1-6

"The word of God came to John, the son of Zechariah in the desert." (Lk 3:3)

In the scriptures, we find numerous encounters with God in places of solitude and quiet. Typical for that part of the world, God's encounters often occur in the desert. I often wondered why that was. Could not God speak to us anywhere he chooses? Why would he choose to communicate with his prophets in such a desolate

Perhaps the answer is that, while God continually reaches out to us, we are not always receptive to Him. Just as we lead lives of busyness and activity, I am sure that those in ancient times also filled their days with hectic toil and labor. When we are on "activity overload," we often confuse what is urgent with what is important and fail to recognize that which is most essential for our being. This happens especially around the holidays when we tend to juggle so many balls in the air, fearful of dropping even one as we try to make the holidays perfect. It is only when we find (or make) the time for God, do we step back from all of our daily activities and routines to contemplate that which is truly important in our lives. These desert times - times of solitude and reflection - can paradoxically be the most fertile of times. It was in the

desert that God spoke to John the Baptist; it was in the desert that John listened and responded to the word of God. So too, can we find God – if only we still our hearts and remain open to His word.

"The Lord has done great things for us; we are glad indeed." (Ps 126:3)

As we are blessed by God, so we must reach out to others less fortunate to share those blessings. Even though we try to capture the "Christmas Spirit," we frequently lose sight of the Gospel message, caught up as we are, with frantic preparations for the Feast. We are best served, and serve best, when we step back, if only for a few moments each day, to reflect upon the goodness of God and His many gifts and blessings. Over the next few weeks, let us take the time to step away from the frenzy and rest in the Lord. In this way, we will be open to His word.

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." (Lk 3:5b)


