Deacon Steve Szmutko's Advent Reflections
December 22, 2024 – Fourth Sunday of Advent
Micah 5: 1-4a Psalm 80: 2-3, 15-16, 18-19
Hebrews 10; 5-10 Luke 1: 39-45

In the final days before Christmas, the readings address the imminent arrival of Jesus, the long-awaited savior. The Messiah had been prophesized in the Hebrew Scriptures and was eagerly anticipated by the Jewish people. We too eagerly await the arrival of Christmas, both for the secular aspects of the holiday and the profound significance of the holy day. As a boy, the longest period of time was the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Today, as a father and grandfather, like most adults, I have found

that the same interval passes far too quickly, leaving precious few days to prepare for the birth of the Lord. From our earliest days, we have often experienced the real pressure of making Christmas perfect. The perfect present, the most beautiful Christmas tree, meticulously decorated twinkling lights, and treasured ornaments, while wonderful in themselves, can add to stress and anxiety if pursued not with love, but with a singular sense of obligation. It is no easy task to take a time out for God, let alone others, when we burden ourselves exclusively with such things.

In today's Gospel, St. Luke describes the meeting of the Blessed Virgin Mary and her cousin Elizabeth – both of whom were blessed with child through unusual circumstances: Elizabeth, a woman advanced in years; Mary, a young virgin, with child through the power of the Holy Spirit. Their meeting was at once touching and profound. It was a celebration of life, and a recognition of the fulfillment of hope and promise. It was a compelling manifestation of the Holy Spirit, both of the Son of God, now carried in the womb of this young woman, and of the knowledge of the truth by her cousin, pregnant with the child who would become John the Baptist.

Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, recognized Mary not just as her cousin, but as the Mother of the Lord. Her own child, who would later baptize Jesus in the River Jordan, and who, just last week, we heard proclaim the coming of the Messiah, leapt with prophetic joy in her womb. What great faith in response to the unspoken witness to the Gospel! What an example of total obedience to God, who entrusted unto them the fulfillment of the messianic promise: Elizabeth, the mother of the last and greatest of the prophets; Mary, the mother of our Lord and Savior. It was a moment of unbridled joy, yearned for, yet never before or since experienced.

The obedience of these two women in accepting and joyfully embracing God's Will, must have been a splendid example for their sons, both as children and, as they both grew to adulthood, in fidelity to their mission. While Jesus, in his divine nature was the only begotten Son of God, the example of his mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, provided him with the example of perfect human conformity to the Father's will. In the Blessed Mother, we find perfection in faithfulness. In her own words, she affirmed her loving and unconditional trust: "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word."

As we anticipate the birth of our Lord, let us remember the total submission of Mary to serve mankind as the mother of Jesus. In her willingness to do God's will, she is the exemplar of devotion and humility – the model to which we all can aspire to emulate. Let us rejoice!

All are invited to take part in this special Christmas preparation and celebration.






