AUGUST 20 ~ TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME READING 1: IS 56:1, 6-7, PSALM 67:2-3,5,6,8 READING 2: ROM 11:13-15, 29-32 GOSPEL: MATTHEW 15:21-28

I have always struggled with today is reading from the Gospel of Saint Matthew. When we have been taught that Jesus came to save *all* men and women, the passage seems to directly contradict that teaching. In response to the Canaanite woman is plea, *Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon,* Jesus did not answer her, telling the disciples only that *I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.* But the woman would not be easily discouraged, even when Jesus said, *It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.* She stood her ground and pleaded, firmly yet respectfully, *Please, Lord, for even the*

dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters. Only then did Jesus acknowledge her request, curing the daughter at that moment: O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.

The lesson of the Gospel is that salvation is open to those who profess their faith in Jesus. The woman was a Canaanite — a people despised by many of the Jews in Jesus Lime. Jesus used the opportunity to demonstrate his love for all men and women. Although the language appeared to be harsh, it no doubt resonated in the hearts of his disciples. And by his healing in response to the persistent entreaties of the woman, Jesus demonstrated the power of faith in him. By drawing the disciples into the heart of the matter on terms they could understand, Jesus Lalvific power was made even more manifest.

The first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah foreshadows the universal nature of salvation. Even foreigners who join themselves to the Lord are saved: . . . for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all people. In the responsorial psalm, we hear these words proclaimed: May God have pity on us and bless us; may he let his face shine upon us. So may your way be known upon earth; among all nations, your salvation.

Note these words — *among all nations* — not some nations, or a few nations, or one nation. Ultimately, God is over all nations, all creation itself. At present, religious divisions throughout the world persist, fomenting religious suffering, particularly in certain regions as the Middle East. This is the madness of evil — to destroy what God has created and impose a darkness that leaves God schildren in suffering and despair.

Let us pray for those suffering from religious persecution throughout the world and remember that only by living out the Gospel message, loving God and loving neighbor, can we truly be disciples of Christ.


ALTAR SERVERS NEEDED
