

AUGUST 4TH ~ THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Reflection

Reading I: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15
Responsorial Psalm: 78:3-4, 23-24, 25, 54
Reading II: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24
Gospel: John 6:24-35

It is unusual, at first reading, that there is no account of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper in the Gospel of John. In fact, at the Last Supper, Jesus' central act is the washing of the feet of his disciples. The other three synoptic Gospels (Mark, Matthew and Luke) all recount the consecration of the bread and wine by the Lord. The earliest account of the institution of the sacrament is found in Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. Yet John does not mention this at all. Why would John omit mention of this central tenet of worship?

As one considers the totality of John's Gospel, we discover that the Eucharist is not omitted at all; however, its expres-

sion is on a different theological level, one that focuses on the totality of Jesus' life as sacrament. This Gospel, according to the introduction provided in the New American Bible, was likely written in the 90s AD, developed out of a different tradition. One can surmise that the readers of John's Gospel were intimately aware of the truth of Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Rather, John reveals the nature of the Savior from a different perspective – the incarnate Word of God, the one by whom the Father was revealed to mankind.

"Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you." (John 6: 27)

Today's Gospel reading was taken from the sixth chapter of John, specifically the *Bread of Life Discourse*. Jesus, having fed the crowd with the multiplication of the loaves, and coming to his disciples on the water, was resting on the opposite shore of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus, recognizing that the crowds had followed him because of the great miracle he had performed and that their bellies were filled, introduced them to an even deeper revelation of his identity. Unlike Moses, who had only asked God to send manna from heaven, Jesus was the True Bread, sent by the Father. Unlike the manna, which sustained the Israelites for but a day, Jesus was the source of eternal life: *I am the bread of life; whoever believes in me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.*"

Many of the followers could not accept that Jesus was the bread of life, just as today, there are many, even among our Catholic brothers and sisters, who find this understanding of Jesus difficult to imagine. Yet, true disciples believe! They know that Jesus is the source and summit of our existence. Through the Precious Body and Blood, the physical presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, Jesus remains ever present in the world. It is a wondrous gift, a source of immeasurable grace, which nourishes us as we journey throughout a perilous world toward the eternal salvation in the Kingdom of Heaven. The Word of God – Jesus Christ – as revealed in John's Gospel, enters our hearts, minds and souls as surely as the sacred Communion enters our body. Together, the four Gospels reveal the facets of Christ's identity – his humanity and divinity, which are inseparable in thought, prayer and worship.




