Making Life Count

The prophet Elisha is welcomed warmly by the couple in Shunem, and he promises them a reward for their hospitality. Jesus tells his followers that he who welcomes you welcomes me, and "he who welcomes me welcomes him who sent me" (<u>Matthew</u> <u>10:40</u>).

How good are we as a society at welcoming people into our

company? An asylum underground operated during the 1980s to give protection to Salvadorans and Guatemalans whom we did not want to welcome. The Haitians have not been so lucky in the 1990s. The homeless are often not welcome anywhere, locked outside by a society that does not want to adequately fund public housing and pursued by the enforcers of laws that make it illegal to be homeless. Stories continue to surface of high-class institutions refusing to welcome African Americans or Jews or women.

Those of us who are baptized "must consider ourselves dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus" (<u>Romans 6:11</u>). We should walk in the light of Christ. We should be different from those who exclude others and drive them out. We should bring God's love to the world:

Basic justice demands the establishment of minimum levels of participation in the life of the human community for all persons ... The ultimate injustice is for a person or group to be treated actively or abandoned passively as if they were nonmembers of the human race. To treat people this way is effectively to say that they simply do not count as human beings.

The Choir of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church is small in number but makes a powerful and joyful noise. You can hear us at every 10:30am Sunday Mass and at special Liturgical Celebrations. We're always looking for a friendly voice to join us.

For decades, Deirdre (Dee) Hindley has led the Choir while also eliciting beautiful music from our massive pipe organ. Many of the members have been singing together since they were children, while others are brand new to the group...which is much like a family.

The talent level is diverse. Some members have performed in community choirs and musical shows, while others sing just for the joy of it. Most of our hymns are from the missalette and we encourage the congregation to sing along. Often, we will prepare a special hymn to be sung during Communion.

We only practice after the 10:30am Mass, when needed, except at Holidays when Dee introduces us to new music.

If you love to sing, we would love to have you join us. While sight-reading music expertise isn't required, some ability to read music is necessary in order to keep everyone on the same page.
