16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 12:13,16-19; Ps 86:5-6,9-10,15-16; Rom 8:26-27; Mt 13:24-43

Let [the wheat and the weeds] grow together until harvest; then at harvest time I will say to the harvesters, 'First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles for burning; but gather the wheat into my barn.' (Mt 13:30)

How can an all-good God allow evil to flourish in a world of His own creation and design? This question has con-founded theologians and philosophers for centuries. In our own lifetime, we have seen good people suffer, while those who embrace the power of evil prosper at their expense. As I am neither a theologian, nor a philosopher, any answer or insight I can provide is amateurish at best. The world often seems to have gone mad, with tyrants and ter-

rorists randomly targeting even the simplest hopes and aspirations of the best of humanity. How can this be?

The most common answer, and the one that makes the most sense, echoed by gifted thinkers throughout time, has been that God has given man the great gift of free will. God, in His wisdom has given us the freedom to either accept or reject Him. Love cannot be compelled, lest it is not love. It cannot be forced, but rather must be freely offered in response to the outpouring grace of Our Heavenly Father. Thus, there are those in our temporal existence, who turn away from the goodness of creation, and succumb to the temptation of evil.

Given this freedom, in the brief span of our earthly existence, we will experience not only the joys of freely given love, but also the sorrows that come from our own human imperfections, and from those who turn away from God to inflict harm and suffering upon others.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the man who sowed good seed. While the household was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds in the field. Once the seeds began to grow, the weeds could not be uprooted without damaging the wheat. Rather, both were bound to grow together. At harvest time, the good and the bad would be gathered separately; the weeds would be tied for burning, while the wheat would be taken into the barn.

Jesus explained that the time between planting and harvest is the age of our temporal existence. At harvest time, the coming age, those who have been faithful will be gathered into the heavenly kingdom, while those who have not will be cast into the fiery furnace. Thus, the question of good and evil transcends our time — our existence in this world — and encompasses all of eternity: God's time.

When considered from the perspective of eternity, the presence of good and evil begins to make sense. We are more than creatures of the body, we are blessed with immortal souls. It is from this understanding, that the triumph of God's ultimate goodness over evil is made apparent. We are given a glimpse of the coming age each time we gather to share in the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus. His kingdom, to those who embrace the Gospel, will be everlasting; the cares of this world will one day be left behind as we are given a place in God's eternal kingdom. *Deacon Steve Szmutko*

Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary on the granting of Plenary Indulgence on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

DECREE

The Apostolic Penitentiary, in order to increase the devotion of the faithful and procure the salvation of souls, by virtue of the faculties attributed to it by the Supreme Pontiff Francis, Pope by Divine Providence, accepting the recent request presented by the Most Eminent Cardinal of the Holy Roman Church Kevin Joseph Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life, on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, already instituted by the Supreme Pontiff on the fourth Sunday of the month of July and which this year will be held on the theme "His mercy is from age to age" (*Lk* 1:50) graciously grants from the heav-enly treasures of the Church the Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer according to the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff) to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by a true spirit of penance and charity, participate on 23 July 2023, on the occasion of the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, at the solemn celebration over which the Most Holy Father Francis will preside in the Vatican Papal Basilica, or at the various functions that will be held throughout the world, a Plenary Indulgence that may also be applied as a suffrage to the souls in Purgatory.

This Court of Mercy also grants the Plenary Indulgence on this same day to the faithful who devote adequate time to visiting, in person or virtually, through the communications media, their elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty (such as the sick, the abandoned, the disabled...).

The Plenary Indulgence may also be granted, provided that they free themselves from any sin and intend to fulfill the three usual conditions as soon as possible, to the sick elderly and to all those who, unable to leave their homes for a serious reason, will unite spiritually with the sacred services of World Youth Day, offering to the Merciful God their prayers, their sorrows and the sufferings of their lives, especially while the words of the Supreme Pontiff and the various celebrations are broadcast through the media.

In order, therefore, that this opportunity to obtain divine grace through the power of the Keys of the Church may be more easily realized through pastoral charity, this Penitentiary firmly requests priests, equipped with the appropriate faculties to hear confessions, to make themselves available, with a ready and generous spirit, for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance.

This Decree is valid for the Third World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.
