Marriages: Arrangements should be made at least one year in advance. Couples are required to participate in a parish marriage preparation program and to attend a pre-marital conference sponsored by the Diocese. Weddings must be scheduled before 2:00 PM on Saturdays.

Reflection on the Sunday Readings 29th Sunday of Ordinary Time

[Reading I: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6](#)

[Responsorial Psalm 96:1, 3, 4-5, 7-8, 9-10](#)

[Reading II: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b](#)

[Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21](#)

*Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's
and to God the things that are God's.*

In today's gospel we find two questions: one put to Christ by the Pharisees, and the other put by him to them.

The Pharisees' question concerns this world alone, while Christ's has an entirely heavenly and other-worldly sense. Their question derived from profound ignorance and perversity; his stemmed from perfect wisdom and goodness.

Whose likeness and inscription is this? Caesar's, they reply. Then give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's. To each, he says, must be given what belongs to him. This, surely, is a judgment full of heavenly wisdom and instruction. For it teaches that authority is twofold, having an earthly and human aspect, and a heavenly and divine aspect. It teaches that we owe a twofold duty of obedience: to human laws and to the law of God. The coin bearing Caesar's likeness and inscription must be given to Caesar, and the one stamped with the divine image and likeness must be given to God . . .
We bear the imprint of your glorious face, O Lord.

Then they handed him the Roman coin.

He said to them:

Whose image is this and whose inscription?

They replied, Caesar's. At that he said to them . . .

*Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar
and to God what belongs to God.*

We are made in the image and likeness of God. So you, O Christian, because you are a human being, are God's tribute money — a little coin bearing the image and likeness of the divine emperor. Therefore with Christ I ask, *Whose likeness and inscription is this?* Your answer is, God's. To which I reply: *Then why not give God what belongs to him?*

If we really want to be God's image, we must be like Christ, for his is the image of God's goodness and the perfect copy of his nature, and God foreordained that those he has chosen should take on a likeness to his son. Christ undoubtedly gave Caesar what was Caesar's and God what was God's. He fulfilled to perfection the precepts of both tablets of the law, becoming obedient unto death, even death on a cross, and he was most highly endowed, both inwardly and outwardly, with every virtue.

In today's Gospel the reply, most wise and discreet, by which Christ sidestepped his enemies' trap shows his great prudence. His teaching that each must be given what belongs to him, and also the example he gave by being willing to pay the temple tax and giving a shekel for himself and Peter, shows his justice. His declaring it to be a duty to pay taxes to Caesar, openly teaching the truth without fear of the Jews who would be offended, shows his fortitude. For this is God's way, of which Christ is the authentic teacher. Those therefore who resemble Christ in their lives, conduct, and practice of the virtues, they are the ones who truly manifest the divine image; for the way to recover this image is by being absolutely just . . . *Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's;* that is, give each what belongs to him.

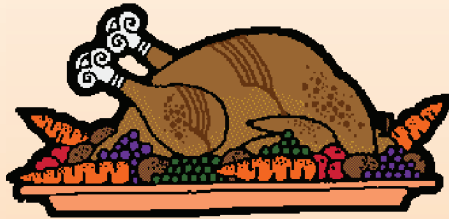

It's Time, time for all of us to get ready because on Saturday, October 31st our Cohort 9 annual Loaves and Fishes Event takes place. Due to Covid-19, we cannot serve our traditional hot meatloaf meal. Instead of asking everyone to make a meatloaf, or brownies, or purchase cookies, or juice or milk, etc., we are asking for and relying on your **financial support** to fulfill our commitment to our friends in need in the Trenton area.

The Loaves and Fishes Committee has met several times now to plan and prepare for our annual Loaves & Fishes Meal serving.

Basically, all meals are curbside service. We are still working out the details of what to serve – possibly something similar to last year's event – a hoagie, some sides and a drink. In addition, we have been asked to continue to provide a take home lunch – peanut butter and jelly sandwich with fruit or a fruit cup. Again we are still working out the details.

This year, Cohort 9 Parishes are not responsible for supplying a host of volunteers. What is needed this year is **financial support**, so that the Committee members can begin to get the ball rolling and purchase what is needed for this event. The average number of people that are fed on the 3rd and 4th weekends of every month is 400, so we need to provide a minimum of 400 main meals and 400 take home lunches.

With the guidelines of COVID-19, we cannot provide an envelope marked "Loaves and Fishes," but rather, we are asking you to please consider putting a **personal envelope in the collection basket marked "Loaves and Fishes."** We will continue to accept donations now through the week of **November 8th**. You can also stop by the rectory to drop off your donation.

At this time, there is a real need to feed the needy in the Trenton area and we are looking forward to keeping our tradition of assistance going strong as we do God's work within our Cohort.

DIOCESAN ADVISORY

Media reports have indicated significant spikes in coronavirus cases in 21 states that have reopened or relaxed restrictions. As we approach the first weekend of public, in-church Masses, we are reminded of the Diocese of Trenton directions, lest there be any confusion:

1. **COVID-19 is still extremely contagious, especially indoors or in closed settings;**
2. **The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday/Holy Day Masses remains in effect so that all Catholic faithful, in good conscience, are not required to be physically present in church; live-streamed Masses will continue in most parishes;**
3. **Anyone who is sick or at risk should not come to church; that is not punitive but, rather, common sense and an act of charity toward your neighbors;**
4. **All parishes are expected to abide by occupancy and other regulations of the Diocese with care;**
5. **Masks must be worn (no exceptions), physical contact of any kind must be avoided, social distancing must be practiced, proper sanitation must be observed at all public, in church Masses;**
6. **Before attending public, in church Masses, the Catholic faithful are asked to consider any possible health and safety risks involved.**

Weekend Masses-Directives & Guidelines

The Diocese has limited attendance at weekend Masses to 1/3 of attendance capacity. For Our Lady of Good Counsel this places us at approximately 220 people per Mass. However, in our pews with proper social distancing we are closer to 200. As our normal weekend Mass attendance, in normal circumstances is approximately 200 per mass, we will not place any restrictions on attendance at this time, but will revisit this if it is needed

- The Bishop continues to keep in place a dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day Obligations so that those who need to may “stay home in good conscience.”

Those in high risk categories should **strongly consider** staying home. Those with the symptoms of any respiratory illnesses **must** stay home.

- All who attend must either enter through the **Main front doors or through the elevator entrance**. The other doors will be locked. You may exit through any door.
- Seating will only be allowed in un-taped pews. Any non-cohabiting families must maintain social distancing of **at least 6 feet** even in the pews that are open. **PLEASE RECOGNIZE THAT YOUR FAVORITE SEAT MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE.**
- Facial masks or coverings must be worn by those who attend the Mass. The Priest and Lector will remove face coverings for the celebration but will wear them at all other times.
- For this initial phase, Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass, not at the usual time. This will happen in both the front and rear of the Church. Please maintain distancing while in line and while exiting the Church. Remove your mask to receive communion and then replace your mask. **Communion in the Hand is strongly preferred at this time.** If you must receive on the tongue please try to wait until the end of the communion line.
- The Restroom in the Choir stairway is available for emergency use only.
- Hand hygiene should be maintained and while Sanitizer will be available at the doors of the Church, parishioners are encouraged to bring their own wipes and sanitizer as well.
- No bulletins, books, or handouts are allowed at this time. Holy Water fonts will be empty.
- There will be no Offertory procession. Collection baskets will be placed near the exits of the Church.
- Due to the danger of the spread of respiratory droplets: congregational singing is discouraged and hymns will not be announced.
- The continuation of public Masses will be contingent on volunteers willing to help sanitize the Church following the Masses.
- The Cry Room and the Sacristy are currently off limits to the public.
- The 10:30AM Mass will be live-streamed and recorded for the time being for those who stay home.

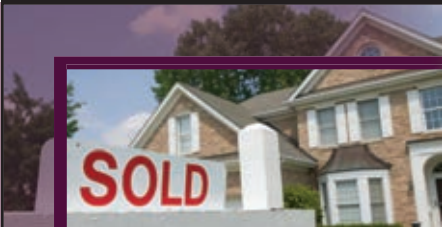
