Reflection Our Lord Jesus Christ the King of the Universe Ezekiel 34: 11-12, 15-17 Psalm 23: 1-3, 5-6 1 Corinthians 15: 20-26, 28 Matthew 25: 31-46

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him." (Matthew 25: 31-32a)

It is hard to believe that another year is coming to a close. The trees stand stripped of their leaves, with branches silhouetted against grey dreary skies. As I write this, a cold rain pelts the windows; outside, all is guiet -the lawnmowers and leaf-blowers have fallen silent -weekend warriors have turned to projects inside their homes.

Liturgically, we are at year's end; the Feast of Christ the King is the last Sunday in the liturgical year. Next week begins the Season of Advent, the time of preparation for the coming of our Lord at Christmas, and the cycle begins anew. Today's readings focus on the end times, and places Christ at the center of history. He, who came to earth to offer himself in sacrifice for our redemption, will return in glory and sit in judgment of all men and women. Saint Paul reminds us, that as we, the descendants of Adam, die, so too in Christ, we shall be brought to life.

The imagery of the New Testament readings contrasts with the shepherd imagery found in Ezekiel and the beloved 23rd Psalm. Yet, God can be seen clearly and consistently in both images. Love and judgment are not mutually exclusive. We are brought into the flock, nurtured in the fold, yet ultimately we shall be judged by the loving kindness that we share with others. Do we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, comfort the ill and imprisoned? Or did we turn way in selfishness? On that last day, we shall be judged in our faith according to Christ's simple words:

"Whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25: 40)
